
#### A TEACH4SPEECH CHILDREN'S BOOK



#### & THE TALENT SHOW



To choose this special group of students, Mr. President is hosting a talent competition with the categories decided by a big spinning wheel...sports...music...and cooking!








The dance team giggles excitedly, jumping around in anticipation.




The cooking class dusts their hands on their aprons and forms a big circle.






Priti loves to do bharatanatyam, which is a traditional dance in South Asia.

#### They decide to call themselves Team X.



are all in attendance.






### The dance team put together a cheer routine.



The cooking team has nothing to show! The judges are not happy.






## As they get roaring applause, the judging panel flashes a 10.



The President spins the wheel again for Round 2. Dance shows up.




The cooking team redeems themselves with a cultural food dance that one of them learned during their family's corn festival.




Finally, Sara played a beat that they could dance to.

Finally, for the last challenge, the teams had to cook up a menu to impress the President!




The cooking class executes a classic menu perfectly, earning a rating of 9.9! They look proud as the judges clap.





However, Hector and Priti work together to make a flavorful spice mix in a comforting tea.


Sara and Carter work together to make a beautiful apple pie from blending their recipes together.

Sara opened up her own mini pie shop, and Carter found new friends





